Collector Note 11: 15 March 1974

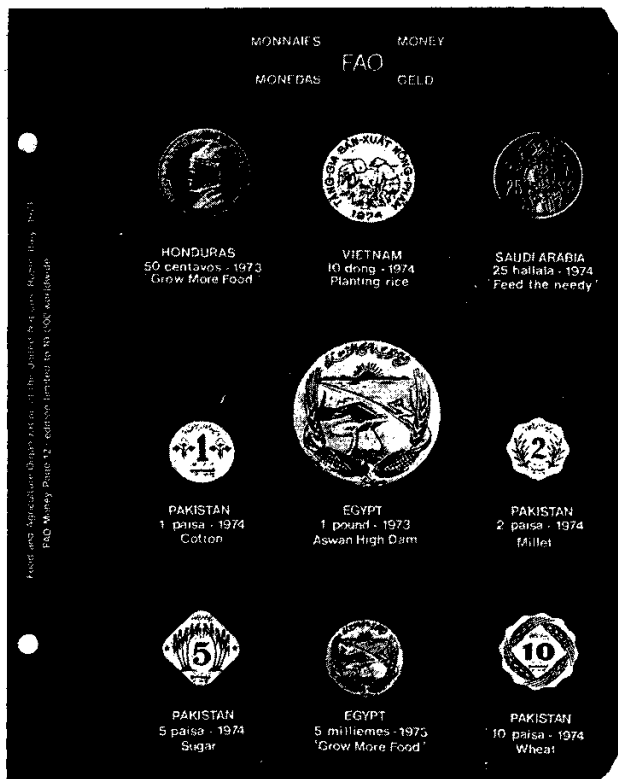
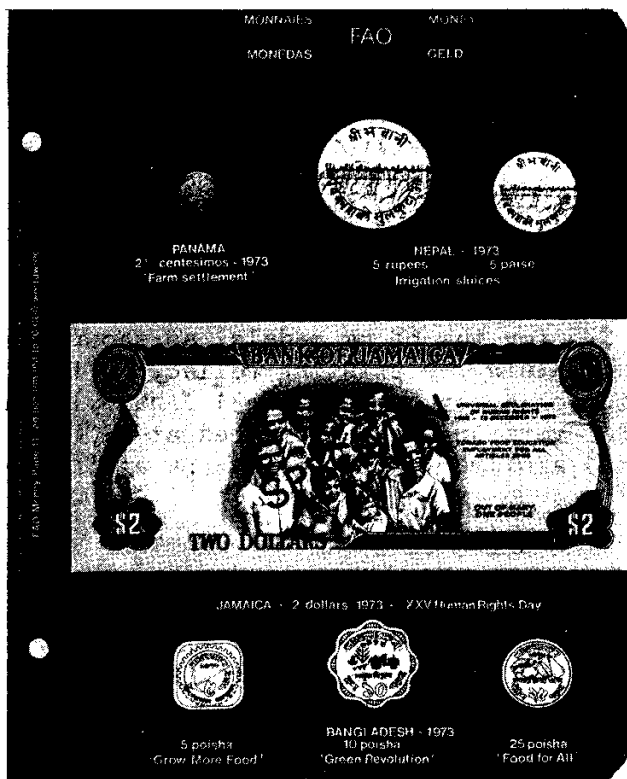
Dear Friend:

Here we illustrate FAO Money Pages 11 and 12. Page 11 will contain the first banknote in the FAO Money collection, a two dollar note issued by Jamaica to mark the 25th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, 10 December 1973, with its ideal of "Food Education Employment for All".

2. The banknote illustrated is a specimen only, but those inserted in the albums will be part of an official issue of 20,000 notes released in Jamaica in March 1974. The Bank of Jamaica has numbered the 20,000 notes from FA 000001 to FA 0200000 and made available for the FAO albums those numbered:

FA 000001 to FA 0100000

The notes therefore form an unusual individualized frontispiece for the 10,000 album owners. The serial number is printed on the obverse of the note: the notes will be placed with the "Food for All" reverse uppermost, but the transparent pocket in which they are housed allows both sides to be seen easily.



3. Pages 11 and 12 were originally planned as the fifth and sixth pages of Album 2. Many collectors have however found that a six-page album is too bulky, and the \$110 lump-sum price of the complete album is a large sum to pay all at once. In future we will therefore provide a new binder with fewer pages. Pages 11 and 12 are accordingly finished in emerald green, and will come in a matching green binder.

4. The Album collections will now be supplied as follows:

(i) All collectors who have paid for the complete six-page Album 2 will receive automatically the green binder with pages 11 and 12, without further charge.

(ii) The green binder with pages 11-14 will subsequently be on sale at \$80. However, collectors who have paid for the complete six-page Album 2 (pages 7-12) will be able to take advantage of a prepublication price till 31 May 1974, by paying \$35 to complete payment for pages 13-14. From 1 June onward the completion price for pages 13 and 14 will be \$40.

(iii) The blue binder with pages 7-10 will be put on sale at \$80. Collectors who wish also to buy pages 11-14 in the green binder may do so at the prepublication price of \$75, valid till 30 April 1974.

5. Pages 13-14 are likely to contain some 16-18 from among the following FAO Money items:

Bhutan 20 chetrum, 10 ngultrum	Indonesia 5 rupiah
Gambia 1 butut	Maldives 1, 2, 5 lari
Ghana 20 pesewas	Malta 1, 2 pounds
Jamaica 1 cent 1974	Mauritius 1, 5, 10 cents
India 10 paise, 10, 20 rupees 1974	Morocco 5, 10, 20 centimes

6. Meanwhile we enclose with this Note a leaflet tabulating the specifications of all 34 coins contained in FAO Money Pages 7-10.


7. Also enclosed is a leaflet describing FAO Medal Panel 1, designed to house the first five Ceres medals. The panel housing will be sent free to persons who have already bought all five medals in bronze, bronze-gilt or silver versions, either all in one version only, or in combination. Collectors who have bought one or more medals, and who now wish to buy the complete panel, may now do so by sending payment for the full panel price minus 20% for each medal they have already paid for.

8. Owing to the recent 60% rise in the price of silver, we have had to raise our silver medal prices to \$65 for the 63 mm and \$75 for the 68 mm medals, as shown on the attached payment form. However, we will maintain for existing collectors till 30 April 1974 the silver medal prices given in Collector Note 10 of 31 January. In addition, FAO Medal Panel 1 in the silver medal version will be offered at \$300, allowing collectors to acquire (or to complete) a silver medal collection at \$60 per medal.

Mailing list

9. We shall soon take off our mailing list persons who have not bought either any FAO Money items or Ceres medals over the past 18 months. However, as our primary aim is to share with you our Food for All ideals, we will keep you on our list even if you have not made any purchases, provided you so request us by 30 April 1974.
