Dear Collector:

Two more regional training courses in agricultural credit for small farmers have been financed recently from Food for All coin proceeds. The first of these, for leaders from cooperatives and agricultural banking institutes in Asia, was held in Bangkok from 7 to 18 October 1974 and attended by 45 persons from 13 countries. The second was held in Quito from 25 to 30 November, and attended by 95 persons from 23 countries in South and Central America. The two earlier regional seminars, for the Near East and Africa, were described in Newsletter 8 of 16 October 1973. An international meeting on agricultural credit, also to be part-financed from the FAO Money Programme, will be held in Rome from 16 to 23 September 1975.

8. The medal of Marie-Thérèse Basse is the final one awaited to complete Medal Panel 2, illustrated below. The medal will be sent out in March, together with the new Medal Panel, to purchasers of the five medals. Medal Panel 2 differs from the mock-up illustrated in Newsletter 13, owing to production problems in London. All five medals in the revised Panel have been struck at the Paris Mint. The earlier medals will now be included in Medal Panel 3 or 4. Panel 4 will contain five medals struck in Milan, Paris (3) and Utrecht, and will be ready about the same time.


9. The four panels are announced in the enclosed medal catalogue, which describes the first twenty Ceres medals, both those already issued and those in production. The catalogue is designed as a convenient reference guide, to allow collectors to add to their medal collection at leisure. FAO will be glad to send extra copies on request, to collectors or their friends.

10. The enclosed catalogue also illustrates the new Medallion Panel 1, revised to include the 22 mm versions of the new Medal Panels 1 & 2. Because of the extra time needed to produce the 22 mm aluminium versions, Medallion Panel 1 will be complete only in late March. Before then complimentary panels will be sent to persons who have bought four or more gold medals, because the Medallion Panels are intended to house these medals also. Medallion Panel 2 will contain the 22 mm aluminium versions of Medal Panels 3 & 4 and will be ready in September.
